An Act Respecting the Dissolution of Zion United Baptist Church of Yarmouth

Be it enacted by the Governor and Assembly as follows:

1 This Act may be cited as the *Zion United Baptist Church of Yarmouth Dissolution Act*.

2 In this Act,

(a) “Church” means the Zion United Baptist Church of Yarmouth, incorporated by *An Act to Incorporate Zion United Baptist Church of Yarmouth, Nova Scotia*;

(b) “Treasurer” means Richard Pitman, Treasurer of the Church.

3 (1) Upon dissolution of the Church, all remaining assets and liabilities of the Church are vested in the Treasurer.

(2) The Treasurer shall discharge the remaining liabilities of the Church and subsequently distribute the remaining assets of the Church in accordance with the Schedule to this Act.

4 The Church is dissolved.

5 Chapter 117 of the Acts of 1960, *An Act to Incorporate Zion United Baptist Church of Yarmouth*, is repealed.
