Cumberland South

Upon the recommendations of the 1992 Electoral Boundaries Report, Cumberland West was renamed Cumberland South. The electoral boundaries were changed to include all of the former Cumberland Centre district and the area south of the Trans-Canada Highway and east of the Nappan River that was formerly part of Cumberland East.

In 2013, following the recommendation of the Electoral Boundaries Commission, this area gained the area south of the Nappan River from Cumberland Norrth.

Cumberland Centre

Chapter 47 of the Statutes of Nova Scotia for 1948 divided the county of Cumberland into three electoral districts: Cumberland East, Cumberland West, and Cumberland Centre.

Cumberland Centre consisted of that portion of the County of Cumberland contained in polling districts Five, Six (except Southampton and Mapleton), Sixteen, and the Towns of Joggins and Springhill.

Upon the recommendations of the 1992 Electoral Boundaries Report, Cumberland Centre was eliminated.
