In 2013, following the recommendations of the 2012 Electoral Boundaries Commission, this district was created by merging Queens and Shelburne. It lost the municipal district of Barrington and all areas in Lunenburg County, but it gained the Maitland Bridge area Digby-Annapolis.

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Electoral History for Queens

Queens

Chapter 21 of the Statutes of Nova Scotia 1992 renamed Queens County to Queens.

In 2003, Queens gained an area on its eastern boundary from Lunenburg West south of Highway 103, through Italy Cross, and to Risser's Beach Provincial Park (SNS 2002, c.34).

In 2013, following the recommendation of the Electoral Boundaries Commission, this district was renamed Queen-Shelburne. It lost the area within Lunenburg County to Lunenburg West and expanded slightly northward to gain the Maitland Bridge area from Digby-Annapolis. It expanded west to the municipal boundary separating the Municipality of Barrington and the Municipality of the District of Shelburne.

Upon the recommendations of the 1992 Electoral Boundaries Report, Digby was renamed Digby-Annapolis Royal. It gained Annapolis Royal, Annapolis Basin/Clements area and Milford/Maitland Bridge area from Annapolis West.

In 2013 following the recommendation of the Electoral Boundaries Commission, this Digby portion of this district merged with Clare Digby and the Annapolis portion merged with Annapolis, excluding the Maitland Bridge area which merged with Queens-Shelburne.
