

I consulting with Marv Berstein, Chief Policy Advisor of UNICEF Canada

He looked at the population sizes of NS, NB, NFLD and SASK (via internet) and the last published Annual Reports of the Child and Youth Advocates in those provinces containing Annual budgets. He also conferred with the former Ombudsman and Child and Youth Advocate in New Brunswick, Bernard Richard, who did a study into the roles of the NB Independent Officer. He and Bernard agreed that an initial operating budget for an independent Children's Commissioner in NS would be somewhere between 1.3 and 1.5 million dollars.


