

Advisory Council on Status of Women Act & Regulations Enacted in 1977, this Act articulates Nova Scotia's commitment to a sustained focus on equity for women.

 Establishes <u>Council</u> - therefore, speaks to role and parameters of Council, and less to specifics of mandate and priorities of the Status of Women office.





Vision & Mandate

To advance equality, fairness, and dignity for all women and girls in Nova Scotia by influencing public opinion, policy, and programming across the province in the following intersecting areas:

- Violence against women
- Leadership
- Economic security
- Health and wellness
