Re: Standing Committee on Public Accounts April 12, 2023 – Accountability Report and Business Plan

Further to our appearance at the above noted committee meeting, Public Works has compiled the attached additional information in response to the following committee requests:

- 1. The amount associated with the Lindsay Construction contract for their construction and management services. What is the management consultant fee for Lindsay to manage this project? How much of that \$15 million is for management fees? (See page 5 and page 21 of transcript)
- 2. The province identified around a hundred public buildings that could have had small-scale wood-heat systems installed. What is the progress of that project? How many wood-heat systems have been installed? How many will be this year? When will all 100 be installed? What is the budget for this? (See page 13/14 of transcript)
- 3. The dates dictated by the federal and provincial governments when work (brush clearing) can be done relative to major projects. (See page 26 of transcript)
- 4. Table a breakdown of current timelines and costs for each of the health care infrastructure projects. (See page 26 of transcript)

Additional Information requested from April 12, 2023, meeting of the Public Accounts Committee:

- 1. The construction management fee for Lindsay is \$67,300 plus HST per Month.
- 2. The Department of Natural Resources and Renewables is leading the wood heat-systems initiatives and have provided the information below:
 - In 2020/2021 a first phase of this project was successfully implemented and consist of 9 buildings (at 6 sites) including 2 district heat systems were selected for conversion from oil to wood chip heating systems The sites are as follows:

- In Fall of 2020 40+ sites put forward for a possible Phase 2; initial assessments completed. List narrowed to 20+ candidate sites shortlist. Mostly Department of Health facilities (Hospitals, Senior Homes) in-review.
- Presently, NRR Wood Heat Initiative is on hold pending allocation of capital.
- 3. For Major Construction Projects, DPW limits vegetation clearing to occur outside of the bird breeding season, which in NS typically ranges end of March/early April to end of August.
- Hwy 107 Sackville-Bedford Burnside Environmental Assessment Condition of Approval:
 - 4.6 The Approval Holder must clear vegetation outside of the breeding season for most bird species (April 15 to August 15), unless otherwise authorized in writing by NSE. Vegetation clearing shall be recorded in a
- Hwy 102 Aerotech Connector EA Condition of Approval:
 - 8.5 The Approval Holder shall clear vegetation outside of the breeding season for most bird species (April 15 to August 31), unless otherwise authorized in writing by Lands and Forestry. Clearing during the breeding season may require additional surveys and mitigations as directed by the Department. Vegetation
